Environment Group Action Plan 2025

The vestry agreed to the environment group action plan for 2025. This can be found on the notice board near the back door of the church. Do take a minute to read our plans for this year. Below are some of the activities we have planned for 2025.

Green Screen

The first screening of 2025 will be on .pm Thursday 1st May at the Ferry Terminal when we will be showing an excellent, uplifting and informative film -*Six Inches of Soil*. This is about farmers here in the UK who are doing something about how to care for nature and the environment through the way we farm. Farmland covers 70% of the Uk, and the way we farm the land is not only important to us as a source of food, but it is important for wildlife and our environment. The film looks at ways that land can be farmed that produces food that is sustainable but also regenerates the land and protects our environment and wildlife

There are further film dates planed for Green Screen: 5th June 2nd October (to coincide with Fairtrade fortnight) and 20th November.

Church Study Day - Peace with Creation

The Eco Congregation Chaplain for Scotland, David Coleman has agreed to lead a study Day on Saturday 30 August 2025, the theme of the study day is Peace with Creation, which will also be the theme of our Season of Creation 2025. <u>Ullapool Unpacked - Circular Meat Packaging Project</u>

The Circular Meat Packaging Project is being run as a collaboration between The Green Bowl "Elphin" and Ullapool Unpacked CIC. The goal of the project is to find a sustainable solution for the sale of local meat in our community, in reusable and returnable packaging. Membership is open to those living locally and costs £10 to join. The packed meat is bought through the Green Bowl online shop or in person at the Ullapool Unpacked Community Refill Shop. The Project cuts out the need for single use plastic packaging and helps support and promote local meat consumption.
